TO : ALL RESIDENTS, EMPLOYEES, EMPLOYERS AND OWNERS OF BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS, OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF GOVERNMENT OFFICES, AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS OF THE CITY OF TAGUIG

RE: Guidelines on Certain Activities during the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) in the City of Taguig

In support of the call of our medical frontliners for a region-wide time-out or stoppage of certain activities, and with the pronouncements of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte on 2 August 2020 declaring the National Capital Region and other high risk areas under Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) for fifteen (15) days effective August 4, 2020, the following guidelines shall be followed, in accordance with the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases' (IATF-EID) Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines with Amendments as of July 16, 2020, City Ordinance Nos. 12 and 13, Series of 2020, Taguig City Executive Order No. 7, Series of 2020, and the other advisories issued by the Taguig Safe City Task Force:

1. MODIFIED ENHANCED COMMUNITY QUARANTINE

This MECQ refers to the transition from GCQ back to MECQ, to answer the call of the medical frontliners for a temporary time-out. It is a period of stringent limits on movement and transportation of people, strict regulation of operating industries, provision of food and essential services, and heightened presence of uniformed personnel to enforce community quarantine protocols.

2. ALLOWED ACTIVITIES AND TAGUIG CITY QUARANTINE PASS

Movement of all residents shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, and for work in permitted offices or establishments or such other activities attached hereto. Individuals must bring their Taguig City Unified Quarantine Pass in order to access essential goods and services.

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3. MINIMUM PUBLIC HEALTH STANDARDS

- a. Even during MECQ, all sectors shall abide by the minimum health standards prescribed by the DOH in Administrative Order No. 2020-0015, as well as sector-relevant guidelines issued by the national government, its offices and attached agencies, as well as the guidelines issued by the City;
- b. According to the latest findings of the University of the Philippines - Philippine General Hospital (UP-PGH) and the World Health Organization (WHO), one of the major sources of community transmission has been traced back to common dining areas and work pantries of colleagues and non-household members. Aside from the minimum health standards imposed, the Safe City Task Force strongly encourages workplaces to implement safety measures and protocols including, but not limited to, shifting break schedules, ensuring social distancing, and limiting venue capacity.

4. CURFEW

The IATF Omnibus Guidelines provides that LGUs can enforce curfew to **non-workers** and to penalize, in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people.

Thus, dispensable travels and mobility for **non-workers** shall be restricted from **8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.**

5. BELOW 21 YEARS OLD, THOSE WITH COMORBIDITIES, HEALTH RISKS, PREGNANT WOMEN, AND SENIOR CITIZENS

Any person below twenty-one (21) years old and sixty (60) years old and above, those with comorbidities, health risks, and pregnant women shall be required to remain in their residences at all times, except for the following:

- a. Obtaining essential goods and services, including access to malls to obtain such goods and services;
- b. Going to and returning from work in offices or industries permitted to operate; and
- c. Accessing Safe Zones.

6. TRAVEL PASS

Applications for Travel Pass are temporarily suspended for fifteen (15) days beginning 4 August 2020.



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7. OUTDOOR EXERCISE

- a. Only one (1) member per household may be allowed to go out of their homes to exercise within their respective barangay;
- b. Though difficult, face masks must be worn at all times;
- c. In compliance with the advice of our City Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance Unit (CEDSU), each individual must maintain a distance of at least five (5) meters from other individuals who are also exercising or working-out;
- d. Individual outdoor exercise allowed, such as outdoor walks, jogging, running, or biking, subject to observance of safety protocols shall be allowed. Operations of clubhouses or similar establishments shall remain closed;
- e. All swimming pools and gyms shall remain closed;
- f. Pet owners may also walk their pets while biking, walking, jogging, or running;
- g. All individuals must present their Quarantine Pass upon inspection or at all designated checkpoints; and
- h. The City, through the Safe City Task Force, barangay officials, building or property managers or any of its authorized representatives, and our police authorities shall strictly implement the safety protocols prescribed by the IATF, DOH, as well as the advisories issued by the City. Any violators shall be apprehended and may be subject to other appropriate actions.

8. COMMON SPACES AND SAFE ZONES

Common Spaces and Safe Zones will now be guided by the following:

- a. Common areas such as open spaces, gardens, parks, walkways and other similar areas may be designated as a safe zone;
- b. Safe Zones are now defined as a specific area and/or specific time in common areas that will be for the exclusive use of Senior Citizens, children, pregnant women and those with comorbidities;
- c. The Barangays, Homeowners associations and building administrators are highly encouraged to declare common areas as safe zones and appoint safe zone administrators to oversee these common areas;

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- d. All individuals shall be allowed to use common areas for a maximum of one (1) hour every morning or one (1) hour in the afternoon per day;
- e. All residents shall be allowed to use the designated safe zone. Children aged twelve (12) years and below must be accompanied by an adult, strictly observe social distancing and wear face masks at all times. Only one (1) child with one (1) adult per household shall be allowed at a time. Mingling with neighbors and other children is prohibited;
- f. Senior Citizens may use a designated safe zone, provided they strictly observe social distancing and wear face masks all the time. If they will use the space for exercise, only one (1) Senior Citizen per household shall be allowed at a time, and the five (5) meter distance rule in the previous item shall be strictly observed. Senior Citizens shall not be allowed to exercise outside designated safe zones;
- g. Walking of dogs and other domestic pets are allowed in safe zones, provided that pet owners wear face masks all the time and social distancing is strictly observed;
- h. Safe Zone Administrators shall implement all prescribed safety protocols in common areas. They are encouraged to log in and log out people in the Safe Zone should contact tracing of those in contact with a positive patient who used the common area be needed; and
- i. The City, through the Safe City Task Force, barangay officials, building or property managers or any of its authorized representatives, and our police authorities shall strictly implement the minimum public health standards and safety guidelines enunciated in the various issuances of the national and city government in all common spaces in public and private areas in Taguig.

9. CONSTRUCTION

- a. The following essential construction projects, whether public or private, such as but not limited to the following shall be allowed to operate:
 - i. Quarantine and isolation facilities for suspect or confirmed COVID-19 patients;
 - ii. Facilities for health sector including those dealing with suspect or confirmed COVID-19 patients;
 - iii. Facilities for construction personnel who perform emergency works, flood control, and other disaster risk reduction and rehabilitation works;



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- iv. Sewerage projects, water service facilities projects, and digital works; and
 - v. Priority public and private construction projects are those that refer to food production, agriculture, fishery, fishport development, energy, housing, communication, water utilities, manufacturing, and BPOs shall operate in accordance with guidelines issued by the DPWH.
- b. Small scale construction projects, as defined by the DPWH, are not allowed. This include interior fit-out and renovation projects.
 - c. Housing service activities, such as plumbing, roofing, and electrical works shall be allowed.

10. TRANSPORTATION AND PRIVATE SHUTTLE SERVICES

a. Public Transportation

- i. All public transportation shall be suspended except point-to-point transport services provided by the government, giving priority to healthcare workers; and
- ii. Tricycle operations shall be allowed at 20% operational capacity per TODA. Only one (1) passenger per tricycle shall be allowed.

b. Use of Motorcycles, Bicycles, including Electronic Bikes

- i. Individuals reporting to work, or those allowed to go out of their homes to purchase essential supplies and/or goods shall be allowed to use motorcycles and bicycles, including e-Bikes, as their means of transportation;
- ii. Only one (1) occupant is allowed in all motorcycles, bicycles and e-Bikes. Back riders are strictly prohibited;
- iii. In addition to face masks, all drivers or riders must wear helmets and other protective gear; and
- iv. All drivers and riders must present their Taguig City Unified Quarantine Pass, Company ID and/or Certificate of Employment (CoE) upon inspection or at all designated checkpoints. However, if the drivers or riders are essential worker/s, they may present their Company ID and/or Certificate of Employment (CoE) only. Individuals caught without the documents mentioned shall be sent

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home immediately and reported to the Barangay for proper monitoring.

c. Private Shuttle Services

- i. The use of shuttle services shall only be allowed to transport frontliners and employees of private companies, establishments, businesses, and industries allowed to operate during MECQ. In any case, all vehicles must display the name of their company on their hoods.
- ii. All other means public transportation such as busses, jeeps, TNVS, taxis, and railways, are not allowed to operate during the MECQ, subject to further rules and guidelines issued by to DOTr, LTFRB, and other national agencies.
- iii. The following are not allowed to avail of the shuttle service unless when indispensable under the circumstances for work in permitted industries or offices:
 1. Any person below twenty one (21) years old;
 2. Any person who is sixty (60) years old and above;
 3. Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities, or other health risks; and
 4. Pregnant women.
- iv. In keeping with the no contact policy, all companies must provide their drivers with a list of employees who will avail of said shuttle services. The driver shall log his name and the attendance of the employees together with the time the latter entered the vehicle prior to departure. Said list shall also be used as passenger manifest or logbook for contact tracing purposes. The list shall be submitted to the employers on a daily basis and to the City Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance Unit, should the need arise.
- v. Shuttle services shall operate in a limited capacity. Social distancing as well as required sanitary measures shall be strictly observed:
 1. Social Distancing:
 - i. For buses, mini buses and jeeps: Passenger load shall not exceed 50% or half of the vehicle's capacity, excluding the driver; passengers should be seated one seat apart; no standing passengers shall be allowed.



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- ii. For jeeps, the passenger seat beside the driver may be occupied by one (1) passenger provided that the driver compartment is sealed off by non-permeable transparent barrier and there is no conductor present during the trip;
- iii. For Vans and Sedans: passenger load should not exceed two passengers per row. The passenger seat beside the driver may be occupied by one (1) passenger provided that the driver compartment is sealed off by non-permeable transparent barrier and there is no conductor present during the trip;
- iv. For sedans, passenger load shall not exceed three (3) passengers. The driver shall be sealed off from the passenger area using non-permeable transparent material.

2. Sanitary Measures:

- i. All drivers shall wear a face mask and gloves;
- ii. All vehicles shall be disinfected thoroughly before and after use;
- iii. All passengers shall wear a mask at all times. Their hands must be sanitized prior to entering the vehicle; and
- iv. All passengers shall undergo checking of body temperature and said temperature shall be logged in the manifest. In case body temperature is 38 degrees centigrade or higher, even after a five (5) minute wait, they are shall be refused entry, and shall be required to go home immediately and report their status to their employers.

11. OPERATIONS OF MALLS AND EATING ESTABLISHMENTS

- a. Limited operations in malls and shopping centers shall be allowed, except for leisure establishments and services which shall continue to be closed;

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- b. Establishments and services allowed to operate in malls and shopping centers may only operate at a capacity consistent with the attached matrix;
- c. Those below twenty-one (21) years old, and those sixty (60) years old and above and those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, and pregnant women, including any person who resides with the aforementioned, may not enter malls and shopping centers except when indispensable under the circumstances for obtaining essential goods and services or for work in establishments located therein; and
- d. Eating establishments shall not be allowed to offer dine-in services. Only take-out and delivery services shall be allowed.

Any person in violation of these guidelines shall be penalized in accordance with Republic Act No. 11469, otherwise known as the “Bayanihan We Heal As One Act,” Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the “Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act” in relation to Presidential Proclamation No. 922, and other applicable laws and ordinances. This will be without prejudice to the filing of an administrative case if the violator is a government official or employee.

GENERAL GUIDELINES APPLICABLE TO MECQ AND GCQ FOR THE CITY OF TAGUIG

1. Minimum health standards shall be complied with at all times
2. Strict home quarantine shall be observed in all households
 - Movement of all residents shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, and for work in permitted offices and establishments or such activities listed
3. Law enforcement agencies shall recognize only the following IDs:
 - Taguig Unified Quarantine Pass (TUQP)
 - IATF IDs issued by regulatory agencies
 - *Bona fide* IDs issued by establishments exempted from the strict home quarantine requirement

 - ✓ May be required to present other documents establishing the nature of their work
4. Movement of cargo shall be unhampered
 - Cargo vehicles as well as vehicles used by public utility companies, BPOs, and export-oriented establishments shall not be subject to an ID system
5. The following shall be required to remain in their residences at all times:
 - Any person below 21 years old
 - Any person 60 years old and above
 - Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks
 - Pregnant women
 - Any person who resides with the aforementioned

Except:

 - i. Indispensable under the circumstances for obtaining essential goods and services;
 - ii. For work in industries and offices;
 - iii. Accessing Safe Zones; and
 - iv. Such other permitted activities like exercise



6. LGUs to enforce curfew only for **non-workers** and to penalize, in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people.
 - Dispensable travels and mobility for **non-workers** shall be restricted from 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

7. All persons are mandated to wear face masks, earloop masks, indigenous, reusable, do-it-yourself masks, or face shields, handkerchiefs, bandanas, N95 masks, or such other protective equipment or any combination thereof, that can be worn over both the nose and mouth which can effectively lessen the transmission of COVID-19.
 - These masks must be worn whenever they go out of their residences for any purpose including travel to work, purchase of basic necessities, attending to medical or emergency reasons, or as part of one's work.
 - These masks must be worn at all times and may not be removed.

8. Supermarkets, public and private wet markets, grocery stores, agri-fishery supply stores, veterinary supply stores, pharmacies, drug stores, and all other retail establishments engaged in the business of selling essential goods are strongly encouraged to extend their store operations to a maximum of 12 hours.

9. Acts of discrimination inflicted upon healthcare workers, repatriated OFWs and non-OFWs, COVID-19 cases, whether confirmed, recovered, or undergoing treatment, as well as suspect and probable cases, and PUM are denounced in the strongest terms.
 - Acts in furtherance of discrimination such as, but not limited to, coercion, libel, slander, physical injuries, and dishonor of contractual obligations, such as contracts of lease or employment, shall be dealt with criminally, civilly, and/or administratively.

10. All Malls are required to observe the minimum health standards laid out by the National Government and Local Government
